These factors, combined with increased use during summer activities, create conditions where minor issues can quickly escalate into safety hazards.

Key safety considerations include verifying that photo-eye sensors remain properly aligned and free from debris, as these devices prevent doors from closing on objects or people. Springs, which bear significant tension and enable smooth door operation, should be inspected for signs of wear or damage. Unusual noises, slow movement, or visible gaps in springs indicate potential failure risks that require professional attention.

Roller condition also affects both safety and performance. Worn or damaged rollers can cause doors to operate unevenly or jump off their tracks, creating dangerous situations. The emergency release mechanism, typically a red cord hanging from the opener rail, should be tested periodically to ensure manual operation capability during power failures.

"Many homeowners don't realize their garage door is the largest moving object in their home," added Hason. "Regular safety checks aren't just about preventing inconvenience; they're about protecting families from potential injury and ensuring reliable operation when it matters most."

The company recommends monthly visual inspections and bi-annual professional maintenance to identify developing issues before they compromise safety. Warning signs that warrant immediate professional evaluation include doors that reverse unexpectedly, fail to stay open, close unevenly, or produce grinding or popping sounds during operation.
