These ice dams trap water that can seep under shingles and into the home, resulting in leaks and interior damage. In summer, excessive heat buildup in an under-ventilated attic can reach temperatures over 150 degrees Fahrenheit, accelerating shingle deterioration from below and increasing cooling costs as air conditioners work harder.

Krumm Exteriors recommends balanced ventilation systems that combine intake vents at the soffits with exhaust vents, often along the ridge, to maintain consistent airflow. This setup helps keep attic temperatures

closer to outdoor levels, reducing moisture accumulation and protecting insulation and roof components.
