



All County Collision Highlights OEM Repair Procedures

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All County Collision announced a continued focus on ADAS calibration procedures as vehicle manufacturers continue integrating advanced safety technologies into modern vehicle designs.

According to the company, advanced driver assistance systems, commonly referred to as ADAS, are increasingly common across today's vehicles. These systems often include cameras, radar sensors, lane departure warning technology, adaptive cruise control, automatic emergency braking, blind spot monitoring, and other driver-assistance features designed to support vehicle safety and awareness.

As these technologies become more widespread, collision repair facilities are increasingly required to evaluate and calibrate vehicle systems following repairs. All County Collision states that calibration procedures may be necessary after certain types of collision damage, component replacement, windshield replacement, suspension repairs, wheel alignments, or structural restoration work.

"Modern vehicles rely on sophisticated electronic systems that extend beyond visible body panels and structural components," said a representative of All County Collision. "Calibration procedures help verify that vehicle safety technologies are operating according to manufacturer specifications after repairs are completed."

The company notes that ADAS components frequently depend on precise positioning and communication between cameras, sensors, radar units, and onboard vehicle systems. Even relatively minor changes to vehicle structure, alignment, or component placement may affect system performance and require verification through calibration procedures.

According to All County Collision, calibration requirements vary by vehicle manufacturer, model, and system configuration. Some vehicles require static calibration procedures performed within controlled environments, while others may require dynamic calibrations completed under specific driving conditions.

The company notes that calibration procedures have become increasingly important as vehicle manufacturers continue expanding the number of safety and driver-assistance features available across their model lineups. Systems that rely on cameras, radar sensors, ultrasonic sensors, and related technologies often work together to support functions designed to assist drivers during everyday vehicle operation.

According to All County Collision, these technologies may influence lane positioning alerts, adaptive speed control functions, parking assistance features, collision warning systems, and other driver-support capabilities. Because many of these systems operate through precise measurements and sensor alignment, repairs involving vehicle structure, suspension components, windshields, or mounting locations may affect their performance and require additional verification.

The company states that calibration procedures are intended to help identify whether safety systems are operating within manufacturer specifications after repairs have been completed. Maintaining awareness of evolving vehicle technology remains an important part of modern collision repair as manufacturers continue introducing new electronic systems and software-dependent vehicle features.

Industry organizations and vehicle manufacturers increasingly emphasize the importance of pre-repair and post-repair scanning procedures as part of the collision repair process. Diagnostic scans can help identify system faults, stored error codes, and communication issues that may not be visible through physical inspection alone. Post-repair scans and calibrations help verify that vehicle systems are communicating properly after repairs have been completed.

The company states that calibration procedures have become an increasingly important component of modern collision repair as vehicles continue incorporating additional safety technologies. Repair facilities

must maintain specialized equipment, technician training, and manufacturer repair information to support these evolving requirements.

Damage that appears limited to exterior panels may sometimes affect sensors, mounting brackets, or related systems located behind those surfaces. The company also notes that customer education plays an important role throughout the repair process. Vehicle owners may be unfamiliar with calibration requirements because many safety systems operate in the background during normal vehicle operation. Providing information about these technologies helps customers better understand the repair and verification procedures associated with modern vehicle restoration.

As automotive technology continues advancing, collision repair facilities face increasing demands related to diagnostics, calibration equipment, technician education, and repair documentation.
