



## **South Shore Home Remodel Offers Custom Home Additions**

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South Shore Home Remodel, a Quincy, Massachusetts contractor led by owner Bob Dougherty, has outlined the range of custom home addition services it provides to homeowners across the South Shore region. The work covers projects that add living space to existing residences, from single rooms to full second stories.

The addition program is handled by an in-house group of contractors who carry each job from the initial design phase through construction. The firm, which also operates as Hancock Renovation South Shore, has worked in residential remodeling for more than a decade and serves more than two dozen communities across the region from its Quincy base.

Home additions are commonly chosen as an alternative to relocating, allowing a household to adapt a current property to changing needs rather than buy and move. That demand often follows shifts such as remote work, multigenerational living, and growing families, all of which call for more usable square footage or a different layout within the same address.

The home additions described span several distinct project types. Among them are kitchen additions that

enlarge cooking and dining areas, family and media rooms built for gatherings, dedicated game and play rooms, indoor-outdoor dining spaces that connect interior rooms to patios and yards, sunrooms designed to capture natural light, second-story additions, and in-law or guest suites for extended household members.

A home addition typically involves more than finishing interior space. Projects often require permitting, foundation or structural work, and exterior finishes that match the existing building, along with extensions of electrical, plumbing, and heating systems into the new area. Coordinating those elements is part of what separates an addition from a cosmetic remodel of a room a home already has.

"Each addition is planned around how a family actually uses its home rather than a standard template," said Bob Dougherty, owner of South Shore Home Remodel. "The goal is for new space to read as part of the original structure, which means the design, the materials, and the construction all have to line up with what is already there."

The company describes a process that begins with a design consultation and proceeds through material selection and construction under a single coordinated team, an approach intended to keep responsibility consistent from the first drawing to the final inspection. The addition category sits alongside the firm's other remodeling work, which includes kitchen, bathroom, basement, garage, and whole-home renovation, as well as new construction.

Matching an addition to an existing house is largely a design problem. Roof lines, window styles, siding, and interior trim all have to be reconciled so that the finished space does not read as an obvious afterthought, a consideration that grows more demanding on older homes with details that are harder to replicate.

Second-story additions feature prominently in the firm's work and are often selected when a lot leaves little room to build outward. Adding a level can supply bedrooms, bathrooms, or a primary suite without expanding the home's ground footprint, though it generally requires evaluation of the existing structure to confirm it can carry the added load. That structural review, along with local zoning and height limits, can shape whether a project builds up or out.

In-law and guest suites address a separate need, giving extended family or visitors a degree of independence within a single property. Interest in that kind of space has tracked the broader rise in multigenerational households, as families look for ways to keep relatives close while preserving privacy for each generation under one roof. Such suites commonly include a bedroom, a private bath, and in some cases a small kitchenette or separate entrance.
