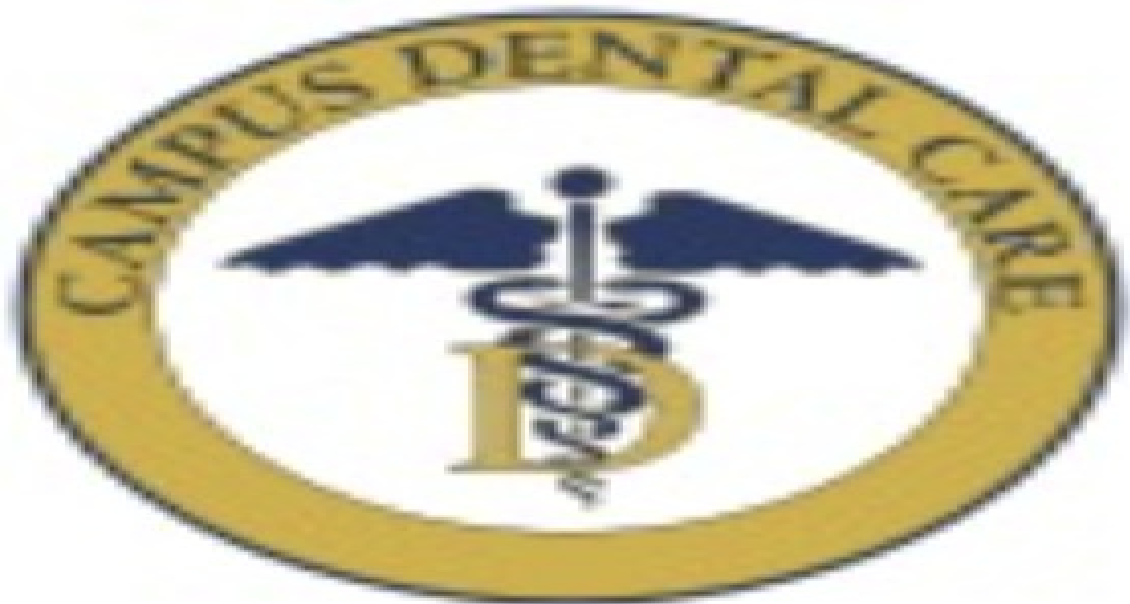




Tooth Extractions Berkeley, CA Reflect a Focus on Timely Dental Care
