Patients with active gum disease, untreated cavities, significant bite concerns, or complex alignment issues may need additional care before starting Invisalign.

Another important question involves provider experience. Patients may want to ask how often the dental practice works with Invisalign cases and what types of alignment concerns are commonly treated.
