Dental bridges function by utilizing dental crowns placed over the natural teeth adjacent to a gap. These neighboring teeth serve as foundational anchors to support a lifelike synthetic tooth suspended between them. By filling the empty space, a bridge effectively distributes biting pressure evenly across the dental arch, which prevents the remaining natural teeth from shifting or wearing down prematurely. The restoration is typically fabricated from durable materials like porcelain or resin, allowing the appliance to blend naturally with the patient's existing smile while restoring the ability to speak clearly and eat comfortably.

Several variations of this restorative treatment exist to accommodate different clinical needs and the specific layout of a patient's mouth. The traditional bridge remains the most common approach, requiring the two anchoring teeth to be shaped so that the supporting crowns can be securely bonded over them. For missing teeth near the front of the mouth that undergo less biting pressure, a Maryland bridge may be considered. This option uses a discreet metal framework bonded to the backs of the adjacent teeth, eliminating the need to modify the enamel of neighboring teeth. In cases where only one stable anchor tooth is available, a cantilever bridge can sometimes be utilized, though this method is generally reserved for specific areas where chewing forces are minimal.

The lifespan of a dental bridge typically spans between 5 and 15 years, depending heavily on the location of the placement and the patient's commitment to daily oral hygiene. Regular professional evaluations are essential to monitor the integrity of the restoration, check the support structure, and ensure the underlying anchor teeth remain healthy.
