



Texas Certified Restoration Publishes Guide Explaining Complete Flood Damaged Home Drying Process

It also answers common homeowner questions, such as whether household fans and dehumidifiers are sufficient, whether families need to leave during the process, and how

technicians confirm that a structure is fully dry.
