



Workers Compensation Lawyer Coalition Addresses Rising Injury Risks Across Atlanta Airport Construction and Healthcare Sectors

ATLANTA, GA - July 08, 2026 -

Workers Compensation Lawyer Coalition today highlighted the growing workers' compensation challenges facing employees across Atlanta's three highest-injury employment sectors, as construction projects expand throughout the city, airport operations intensify at Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport, and healthcare facilities experience increased workplace injury claims.

The legal network, which specializes in workers' compensation cases throughout Georgia, reports that Atlanta's construction boom, airport ground operations, and healthcare sector present unique risks that often lead to delayed injury reporting and complicated claims processes. These sectors collectively employ hundreds of thousands of workers who face specific hazards that can trigger Georgia's strict 30-day injury reporting requirement.

Atlanta's construction industry currently employs approximately 250,000 workers according to the Associated

General Contractors of America, with major projects including the \$5 billion Centennial Yards development, The Stitch infrastructure project, and continued Beltline expansion. Bureau of Labor Statistics data shows construction fatal injury rates in Georgia have risen steadily since 2018 to their highest levels in over a decade.

Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport, recognized as the world's busiest airport by passenger traffic, employs thousands of ground crew members, baggage handlers, and service workers who experience repetitive strain injuries and equipment-related accidents. These workers may be employed by airlines including Delta Air Lines, ground service contractors, or the City of Atlanta, with each employment relationship creating distinct workers' compensation claim structures.

The healthcare sector, anchored by facilities including Grady Memorial Hospital, Piedmont Atlanta, and Emory University Hospital, employs tens of thousands of nurses and support staff who face back injuries from patient lifting, needle-stick incidents, and slip-and-fall accidents. Healthcare consistently ranks among the top three industries nationally for workers' compensation claim volume.

"Workers in Atlanta's construction, airport, and healthcare sectors often don't realize they have a compensable injury until symptoms from repetitive strain or overexertion become debilitating," stated a spokesperson for Workers Compensation Lawyer Coalition. "By that time, Georgia's 30-day reporting window may have already closed. Additionally, large employers in these sectors often operate employer-directed occupational health programs structured to facilitate return to work rather than document injuries for maximum benefit eligibility."

Under Georgia workers' compensation law, injured workers must report workplace injuries within 30 days of the incident. This deadline proves particularly challenging for airport, construction, and healthcare workers whose symptoms from repetitive strain injuries, overexertion, and occupational exposures develop gradually over time.

Georgia employers must post a Panel of Physicians listing at least six approved providers. Workers who seek initial treatment from providers not on the panel risk losing coverage for that treatment. Large self-insured programs at airports, construction companies, and hospitals may direct workers toward in-house providers whose recommendations align with employer return-to-work priorities.

The Georgia State Board of Workers' Compensation, headquartered at 270 Peachtree Street NW in Atlanta, administers claims for more than 250,000 employers and 3.8 million Georgia workers. As the administrative center of the state's workers' compensation system, Atlanta serves as the primary hearing venue for contested claims from Fulton, DeKalb, and surrounding metro counties.

WCL ATL Atlanta workers' compensation lawyer services are available to workers facing these challenges, with the coalition maintaining dedicated practice areas for airport workers' compensation, construction accidents, and hospital workplace injuries. The network provides representation for workers navigating Georgia's complex workers' compensation system, including assistance with delayed injury reporting, panel-of-physicians requirements, and benefit disputes.
