Breast implants are medical devices, not lifetime devices, and carry risks that should be reviewed carefully with a board-certified plastic surgeon before surgery.

Fat transfer breast enhancement may be discussed for patients seeking a more modest change using fat removed through liposuction and transferred to the breasts. This option can appeal to patients who prefer a softer volume increase and have adequate donor fat. At the same time, fat transfer has limits. The amount of volume added is typically modest, and how much of the transferred fat is retained can vary.

A breast lift may be a better fit when breast position, nipple placement, or skin laxity is the primary concern. Adding volume alone does not reliably correct significant sagging. In some cases, augmentation with lift may be considered when both volume and breast position need to be addressed. The decision depends on tissue quality, desired shape, scar considerations, and the amount of lift needed.
