



Countertop Fabrication Services Enhanced With Fully Wet-Cut Process and Transparent Shop Access

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Atlanta Surface Masters, a countertop fabricator and installer serving homeowners and businesses across the metropolitan region, has announced a series of enhancements to its core fabrication services, built around a fully wet-cut production process, a ventilated fabrication facility, an expanded protective-equipment program, a strengthened training program, and direct customer visibility into the shop floor.

The enhancements formalize and expand the practices that shape how the company fabricates and installs quartz, natural stone, and other surfaces for kitchen and bathroom projects. Together, they place fabrication quality and shop transparency at the center of the service, rather than treating them as steps that take place out of view after a slab has been selected. The changes apply across every project the company handles, from residential kitchen remodels to commercial bathroom installations.

At the center of the enhanced service is a fabrication process in which all materials are wet-cut. Wet cutting introduces water at the point where the stone is cut, ground, and polished, which controls the dust generated during fabrication and supports cleaner, more precise edges. Atlanta Surface Masters has confirmed that no dry cutting takes place at its facility and that every project moves through the same wet-cut process from the

first cut to final finishing. Using a single method across all work is intended to produce consistent results regardless of the material or job size.

The fabrication facility is arranged to remain well ventilated throughout the production day, which keeps the working environment clean and the process steady from one project to the next. A controlled shop environment supports the accuracy of fabrication demands, particularly for detailed work such as sink cutouts, seams, and edge profiles, where small variations in working conditions can affect the finished surface. The company has positioned the ventilated facility as a foundation of the enhanced service rather than an afterthought.

As part of the enhanced service, Atlanta Surface Masters equips its fabrication team with protective equipment, including goggles, masks, and gloves, as standard practice in daily operations. Treating protective equipment as routine reflects the professional standard the company applies to the work and the environment in which its team operates. The measure sits alongside the wet-cut process and the ventilated facility as part of a single, consistent approach to project production.

Atlanta Surface Masters has also expanded the training that supports its fabrication work. Every new hire receives material-handling training, and employees and subcontractors participate in ongoing product and fabrication training. The training program is designed to keep everyone who handles a project working to the same standard, so that the way a slab is measured, cut, and finished does not vary from one team member to another. For customers investing in a premium surface, consistency in handling is a direct factor in the quality of the finished countertop.

A defining feature of the enhanced service is the level of access customers have to the fabrication space. The company has installed a glass door between its showroom and its fabrication area, allowing customers to view the shop floor directly from the showroom. The arrangement gives buyers a clear view of the environment where their countertops are produced, an openness that is uncommon in an industry where fabrication typically happens away from the customer. The glass door turns the production space into something customers can observe rather than imagine.

The combination of a wet-cut process, a ventilated facility, a trained team, and an open view of the shop is intended to give customers a clearer understanding of how finished countertops are produced. For homeowners and businesses selecting a surface for a kitchen or bathroom, the fabrication stage determines the fit, the edge profile, and the finish of the final installation. The enhanced service is structured to make that stage visible and consistent, so that the standard applied on the shop floor is something a customer can see rather than take on trust.

"Every countertop that leaves the shop is wet cut, the fabrication area is built to stay ventilated, and the team

works with protective equipment as a matter of routine," said Daniel DePaula of Atlanta Surface Masters. "The glass door was added so that customers can look straight into the fabrication area from the showroom and see exactly how the work is done."

Beyond fabrication, Atlanta Surface Masters provides measuring, templating, and installation for the surfaces it produces, handling projects from slab selection through to the finished countertop. The enhanced service keeps these stages connected under a single process, so that the same standards applied on the shop floor carry through to installation at home or in a business. Connecting fabrication and installation into a single process is intended to reduce gaps that can arise when separate parties handle different stages of a countertop project.

"Fabrication is the stage where a slab becomes a finished countertop, and keeping that stage open to view reflects the standard the company sets for the work," said DePaula.

The enhanced services are now available to customers across the metropolitan area planning kitchen and bathroom countertop projects. Atlanta Surface Masters works with quartz, natural stone, and additional surface materials and fabricates each to the specifications of the individual project.
