



Amid E-Cigarette Explosion Lawsuit Filings, Man Seeks To Warn Current Users

LipsigLawyers.com reports on the details of a concerning news release from JDNews.com regarding a 54-year-old man who turned to electronic cigarettes when trying to quit smoking. The move, though well intentioned, is something he has come to regret following an e-cigarette explosion that he alleges left him temporarily blind and in significant pain.

The reported victim, Joe Vecchione of Sneads Ferry, North Carolina states that the explosion happened around 11:45 at night when the device suddenly "erupted" in his face. "My eyes were burning," the man noted, "It was like a bunch of hot oil hit my face." Devices like the one the man described using do, in fact, depend on a liquid substance called "juice" to work. The brand the man indicates using reportedly contains both propylene glycol and alcohol, two combustible liquids.

The man states that he was taken to the hospital and treated for burn injuries overnight. He indicates that he had been unaware of this danger when choosing to use the product and notes that, "The warning on the box was so small, I could hardly read it." He says, "I had no idea it could pack a punch like that."

Reports of e-cigarette explosions have been mounting in recent years, showing that the devices may be more dangerous than the general public believes. Although the FDA does not keep official statistics regarding the frequency of these e-cigarette explosions at this time, they are encouraging people who have suffered from adverse events like this to contact them through the MedWatch program on their web page.

In more recent news, a boy in Brooklyn may be permanently blind in his left eye after a reported e-cigarette battery explosion at a mall kiosk. The young boy, just 14 years old, suffered severe burns to his hands as well and says that he has suffered from a ripped cornea due to the explosion.
