



RestoPros of North Boston Releases Homeowner Guide on Wind Driven Rain and Hidden Water Intrusion

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RestoPros of North Boston has released a new homeowner guide focused on wind driven rain and the hidden water intrusion it can cause following summer storms across the North Shore. The guide arrives during an active summer storm season, when high winds frequently accompany heavy rainfall throughout communities including Lynn, Wakefield, Reading, and Melrose.

The guide explains a problem that often goes unnoticed by property owners. During high wind events, rain is pushed sideways rather than falling straight down. That horizontal force drives moisture into gaps around window frames, door thresholds, siding joints, and roof flashing that are never exposed to ordinary downward rain pressure. Because these entry points sit behind exterior surfaces, water can work its way through framing and insulation while leaving almost no visible sign at first.

The company notes that this delayed pattern is what makes wind driven rain difficult for homeowners to detect on their own. Moisture trapped inside wall cavities can lead to rot, insulation damage, and mold growth in the weeks and months after a storm passes, long after the visible weather event has ended. The new guide outlines wind damage to roof signs and next steps so that residents can recognize early indicators and

understand when a professional inspection is warranted.

"Most people look up at their roof after a storm and assume that a lack of missing shingles means everything is fine," said Paul Burns of RestoPros of North Boston. "The damage that concerns us most is the water that entered sideways and disappeared behind a wall. By the time a stain appears on the ceiling or a musty smell develops, the moisture has often been sitting inside the structure for weeks."

The guide reflects the company's broader work in storm damage restoration North Boston MA, where technicians document moisture readings, trace the path of intrusion, and identify affected materials that are not visible to the eye. RestoPros of North Boston reports that early inspection frequently reveals problems that would otherwise remain concealed until repairs become far more extensive.

To support North Shore residents during the current storm season, RestoPros of North Boston is offering free post storm inspections for homeowners in Lynn, Wakefield, Reading, and Melrose. The service is part of the company's approach to storm damage restoration Lynn MA and surrounding areas, where crews assess both obvious exterior damage and the concealed moisture that wind driven rain leaves behind.

"Our goal with this guide is education," Burns added. "A homeowner who understands how sideways rain behaves is far better prepared to act before a small point of entry turns into a structural repair."
