



Arizona Painting Company Addresses HOA Color Rules for Homeowners

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Arizona Painting Company is drawing attention to a situation it handles regularly across North Phoenix's master-planned communities: homeowners in neighborhoods governed by a homeowners association who want an exterior repaint but have to keep the new color within their association's approved range and are often unsure how to do it. The company points to color consulting and approved-color selection as the practical way owners can move ahead with confidence rather than risk a rejected submission.

Arizona Painting Company provides residential interior and exterior painting for homeowners across North Phoenix, including color consulting and HOA-compliant color selection for properties in master-planned communities such as Desert Ridge and Tatum Ranch. Many of these projects pair an exterior repaint with interior work, so a household can refresh both the outside of a home and its main living spaces in a single coordinated effort.

The friction usually comes at the approval stage. A homeowners association typically reviews a proposed

exterior color before any work begins, and a submission that falls outside the approved range comes back for revision, adding time to a project the owner expected to move quickly. Color consulting is aimed squarely at that step, narrowing the choices to shades that read well against a home's existing stone, roof tile, and desert surroundings while still sitting inside the palette the association has set, so the selection clears review the first time.

The exterior work itself most often involves stucco, the dominant surface on homes throughout the area, where careful preparation and an even, long-lasting finish matter as much as the color on the chart. Crews address cracks and worn areas before any topcoat goes on, since a coating is only as durable as the surface beneath it. Owners weighing a project can review the company's residential work on the Phoenix page before deciding how to proceed.

"In a lot of these master-planned neighborhoods, owners come to us knowing they want to repaint but worried about getting the color wrong with their HOA," said Doug Caris, CEO of Arizona Painting Company. "We would rather help them get it right the first time, so we walk them through color consulting and approved-color selection up front, then handle the interior work cleanly while we are there. We keep people updated on their project as it goes, and a foreman checks every job, so there are no surprises."

Interior painting frequently runs alongside the exterior repaint. Crews handle walls, ceilings, trim, and doors, and the company also removes dated popcorn ceiling texture for owners updating older rooms. Color consulting extends indoors as well, where owners have a free hand on shade and often want help coordinating wall, trim, and ceiling tones across connected rooms. Because much of this work happens inside an occupied home, interior projects are organized to keep daily disruption low, with floors and furnishings protected and rooms taken in a sequence that leaves the rest of the house usable while the job is underway.

Caris added that the interior side matters just as much to the households the company works with. "People are living in these homes while we paint, so we plan the inside work room by room and keep things tidy as we go," he said. "A family should barely have to change how they use the house while we are there."

The company is a foreman-led process, in which a single supervisor oversees each job from the first coat through the final walkthrough. For homeowners comparing painters, that combination of an independent endorsement and a named on-site point of contact is intended to make a repaint feel accountable from start to finish.

For homeowners in North Phoenix's HOA-governed communities, the appeal is straightforward: an exterior repaint that clears the association's review the first time, paired with interior work that finishes without turning a household upside down.
