



Cutarelli Vision Publishes Article on Second LASIK Consultations in Denver, Colorado

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Cutarelli Vision, a LASIK surgeon located in Denver, Colorado, has published a new article addressing why patients considering laser vision correction benefit from obtaining a second consultation before proceeding with surgery. The article, titled "Why Not Getting a Second Denver LASIK Consultation Is a Bad Idea" examines differences in diagnostic standards, surgical technology, and candidacy determinations across refractive surgery providers, and identifies several factors patients in Denver and the surrounding Colorado Front Range should weigh before scheduling surgery. Cutarelli Vision treats patients from four offices, with its primary location in Denver and additional practices in Fort Collins, Boulder Valley, and Colorado Springs.

Patients throughout Denver and the surrounding Front Range seeking LASIK undergo preoperative evaluations that include corneal topography, wavefront analysis, pupil measurement, and tear film assessment. The same evaluations are used at the practice's Fort Collins, Boulder Valley, and Colorado Springs offices for PRK, SMILE, EVO ICL implantable lenses, and Refractive Lens Exchange (RLE), the four additional refractive procedures Cutarelli Vision performs for patients whose anatomy or refractive error makes an alternative to standard LASIK a better fit. According to the practice, Dr. Paul Cutarelli has performed over 90,000 vision correction procedures since entering practice in 1995, and Cutarelli Vision

reports an over 95% success rate across its refractive surgery caseload.

The article explains that a second consultation frequently surfaces diagnostic details that a first visit did not capture. Corneal thickness, pupil size, early indicators of keratoconus, dry eye syndrome markers, and the degree and type of astigmatism can each influence which procedure is suitable for a given patient. Cutarelli Vision notes that patients in Denver who visit the practice after an initial consultation elsewhere sometimes learn they are candidates for a procedure they were previously told was not available to them. In other cases, the second visit reinforces the first finding with added clarity on which procedure and technology will best serve the patient's visual goals. The article contends that in either outcome, the second consultation supports an informed decision rather than a rushed one.

The article also addresses why practices that perform only LASIK may have limited incentive to discuss alternatives. PRK reshapes the cornea without creating a flap and can be suitable for patients whose corneal thickness places standard LASIK outside a safe range. EVO ICL is an implantable collamer lens positioned between the iris and the natural lens, and can be an option for patients with high myopia or hyperopia who are not ideal laser candidates. SMILE is a flap-free laser procedure appropriate for a subset of nearsighted patients, and Refractive Lens Exchange (RLE) replaces the eye's natural lens and is often considered for patients in the presbyopic age range. Cutarelli Vision offers all five procedures across its Denver, Fort Collins, Boulder Valley, and Colorado Springs locations.

"With over 90,000 procedures performed since 1995, I have encountered a wide range of patient anatomy and visual needs," said Dr. Paul Cutarelli, MD, a Johns Hopkins-trained, board-certified corneal specialist and founder of Cutarelli Vision. "A second consultation gives patients a fuller picture of what is possible for their specific corneas, prescription, and lifestyle. We take pride in telling patients yes every day, including many who arrive at our Denver office after being told elsewhere that they were not candidates for vision correction."

Dr. Cutarelli completed his medical degree at Case Western Reserve University in 1991 and his ophthalmology residency at the Wilmer Eye Institute at Johns Hopkins Hospital from 1992 to 1995. He completed a fellowship in refractive surgery at the Hunkeler Eye Center in Kansas City and a fellowship in anterior segment surgery and ocular disease at Moorfields Eye Hospital in London. He is a member of the American Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgery, the American Academy of Ophthalmology, and the American Medical Association. Cutarelli Vision is surgeon-owned and operated and is not affiliated with a corporate chain.
