The Spanish Fork-based company highlights five critical warning signs that indicate an air conditioning system may need repair or replacement. These indicators include weak airflow from vents, uneven cooling throughout the home, frequent repair needs, rising energy consumption, and declining performance during extreme summer temperatures.

"Many homeowners wait until their air conditioning completely fails before considering replacement, often

during the hottest days of summer when contractors are busiest," said Alisha Casey of HRC Climate Services Heating and Cooling. "Understanding these warning signs allows families to plan ahead and avoid emergency situations that can leave them without cooling for days or weeks."

Weak airflow typically signals problems with the blower motor, ductwork issues, or a failing compressor. When certain rooms remain warm while others cool properly, the system may be struggling with refrigerant levels, thermostat malfunctions, or inadequate sizing for the home. These issues often worsen over time, leading to complete system failure if left unaddressed.

The frequency of repairs serves as another crucial indicator. Air conditioning units requiring multiple repairs within a single cooling season often cost more to maintain than to replace. Additionally, systems older than 10-15 years typically operate at lower efficiency standards than modern units, resulting in higher monthly utility bills even when functioning properly.

Rising energy costs without increased usage patterns suggest declining system efficiency. Older air conditioning units work harder to maintain comfortable temperatures, consuming more electricity in the process. Modern systems feature improved SEER ratings and advanced technology that can reduce cooling costs by 20-40 percent compared to units installed before 2010.

"Homeowners should also consider that refrigerant regulations have changed significantly in recent years," added Casey. "Older systems using R-22 refrigerant face increasing service costs as this refrigerant is phased out, making replacement more economical than continuing repairs."

Poor performance during peak summer heat represents perhaps the most concerning sign. When an air conditioning system cannot maintain comfortable indoor temperatures despite running continuously, it indicates the unit can no longer meet the home's cooling demands. This situation not only affects comfort but also places excessive strain on system components, accelerating wear and potential failure.

The company emphasizes that regular maintenance can extend system life and improve performance. Annual tune-ups include cleaning coils, checking refrigerant levels, inspecting electrical components, and optimizing airflow. These preventive measures help identify potential issues before they develop into costly repairs.
