Aluminum weighs roughly a third as much as steel, which matters for transportation costs, crane requirements, and installation labor. A rooftop unit, a signage frame, or a trailer body built from aluminum may cost more per pound of raw material but save money elsewhere in the process. Steel, on the other hand, remains the workhorse for framing, supports, and anything that needs to hold serious weight without flexing.

Workability also shapes planning decisions. Some alloys weld easily and forgive mistakes; others require

specialized equipment, certified welders, or specific filler materials. Copper and brass machines look beautiful but cost more. Certain stainless grades harden as they are worked, slowing cutting and drilling. Fabricators who understand these behaviors in advance can quote jobs more accurately and avoid surprises on the shop floor.
