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The Law Offices of Humberto Izquierdo, Jr., PC emphasizes that Georgia workers must report workplace accidents to their employer within 30 days or potentially forfeit workers' compensation benefits. The State Board of Workers' Compensation advises employees to report accidents immediately and in writing whenever possible, yet many workers remain unaware of this crucial deadline that can determine their eligibility for medical treatment and wage benefits. As an experienced Atlanta workers' comp lawyer, the firm stresses the importance of proper documentation during this critical window.

Employees in Atlanta's construction, logistics, airport, healthcare, hospitality, manufacturing, and warehouse industries often continue working after a work injury because symptoms initially appear minor. Back injuries, repetitive trauma, head injuries, or lifting accidents may worsen over time, leading workers to delay formal reporting. Simply telling a coworker about an incident may not create the documentation needed to prove when and how the employer received notice, potentially jeopardizing a legitimate claim.

"Workers should never wait for symptoms to become unbearable before taking action," states Humberto

Izquierdo, Jr., founder of the Law Offices of Humberto Izquierdo, Jr., PC. "The proper steps include reporting the accident to a supervisor, documenting the notice in writing, requesting information about the authorized physician panel, preserving all medical and employment records, and determining whether a WC-14 claim must be filed with the State Board. The Board requires that a WC-14 be used to formally file a claim and must also be sent to both the employer and workers' compensation carrier."
