Without the ongoing mechanical stimulation provided by natural tooth roots, the jaw slowly loses its structural width and height over time. This loss of bone volume can complicate or prevent the placement of dental implants, which require sufficient bone mass to integrate successfully into the jaw. Addressing this deficit early in the restoration process allows patients to qualify for tooth replacement options that would otherwise be unavailable due to tissue loss.

The procedure itself can involve various techniques depending on the location of the missing tooth and the severity of the loss. In some instances, minor bone building can take place at the same time an implant is positioned. In more extensive cases, the newly grafted tissue must heal and fully integrate with existing bone before any implant post can be surgically inserted.

While the healing period for bone grafting extends the overall length of the dental implant process, establishing a stable foundation prevents future complications and reduces the likelihood of implant failure.
